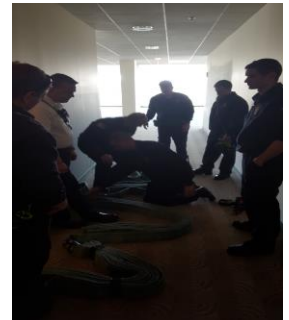
Fireground Ladder Operations

Portable ladders are the most functional versatile, durable, and rapid deployable tools on the fireground. The training focused on the deployment of the full complement of ladders supplied on Tower 53 and Ladder 51. Along with the deployment of the ladders each member was required to climb the ladder and prepare to receive a victim from one of the accessible windows. The ladders consisted of 16, 18, 24, 28, 35 and 40 portable ground ladders



Hose Line Deployment/Lead-outs

Whether in a flat load, accordion load, a horseshoe load or a double horseshoe all company members must have a good understanding of how it is deployed. The initial 100' to 200' of hose properly deployed will have a positive impact on how the advancement of the hose goes into the structure. These are also referred to as hose line lead-outs.



Live Fire Training

The simulated live fire training is accomplished annually at the Naperville Fire Department training tower. This is a mandatory annual topic. The training accomplished the mandatory live fire training for ISO and allows the fire department community to training on the same topics and evolutions. This is completed each year with our MABAS 16 partners.
