Hazardous/Vacant Structures Identification

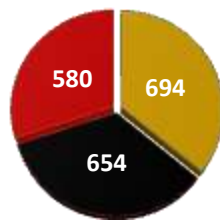

All Hazard Evacuation Drill Training

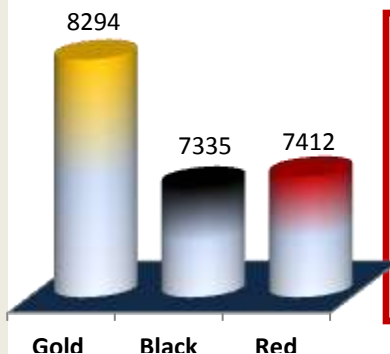
