Unified Training with Lisle Police

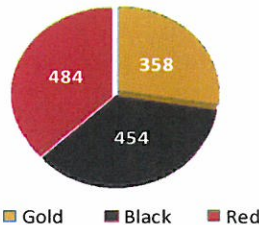
From fire operations to emergency medical operations to hostile work zones created in a domestic situation or a hostile shooter requires the cross training of both fire and law enforcement personnel. Throughout the month a great deal of preliminary training has taken place to prepare of the situations that may be presented. In February concealed carry and weapons safety was covered with a large cross section of our personnel. Through March we will train all personnel how to handle a weapon that may be found on a patient.

Cribbing and Stabilizing with Rescue 42 struts

Prior to working in the Hot Zone or climbing under a rolled over vehicle the vehicle requires cribbing and stabilization. This allows for all emergency personnel to work safely in the Hot Zone and under and unstable vehicle on or off the roadway.
