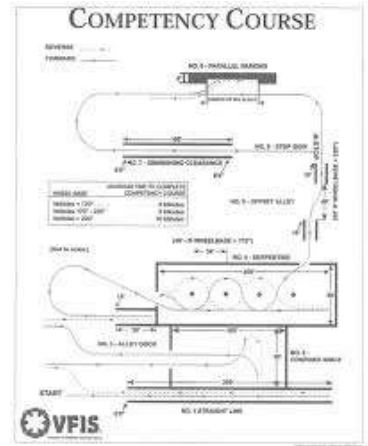

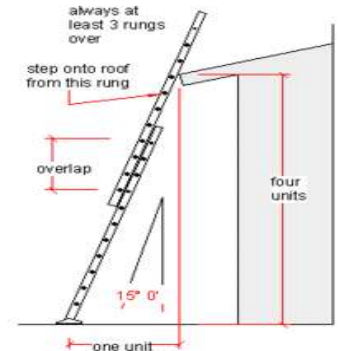
Driver Training

The annual driver training is completed by navigating through a designed course to evaluate the driver's level proficiency. The course has several components to evaluate abilities, backing, diminishing clearance, alley dock backing and serpentine forward and backward. This is completed using a frontline piece of fire apparatus, such as an engine or truck.

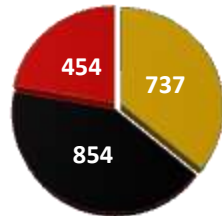


Ladder Drills and Triage

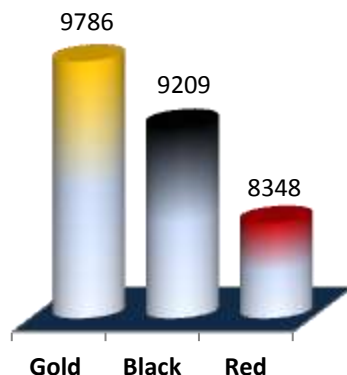


Shift Training Hours
